CODFISH BREAKFAST

FISH CHOWDER

Another local dish Bermudians take seriously is fish chowder. According to our judges, **Lobster Pot** (*6 Bermudiana Road, Hamilton, 292-6898*) is the one place that makes “consistently good” fish chowder.

FISH SANDWICH

A perennial winner in this category, **Art Mells Spicy Dicy** (*9 St. Monica's Road, Pembroke, 295-3965*) once again takes the trophy for best fish sandwich. With soft, fresh bread, piles of perfectly fried fish and oozing, tangy tartar sauce, it's an unforgettable meal big enough to share—but you probably won't want to.
